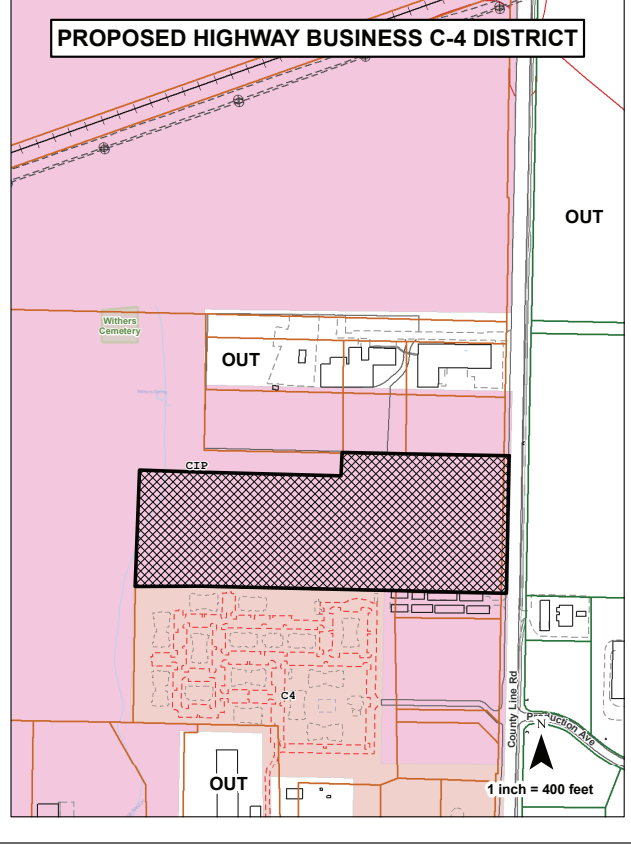

WHEREAS, Microwave Dave has represented Huntsville, Alabama on regional, national, and international stages, serving as a cultural ambassador for the city's music community; and

WHEREAS, Microwave Dave's leadership, mentorship, and advocacy have helped cultivate the next generation of musicians and strengthened Huntsville's creative ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, Microwave Dave's commitment to music education and community outreach initiatives have enriched the quality of life for citizens in Huntsville; and

WHEREAS, Microwave Dave's contributions have elevated Huntsville's reputation as a city that values music, art, education and cultural heritage as essential components of our community identity; and

WHEREAS, in addition to these laudable and widely known accomplishments Microwave Dave was also an avid lover of animals who cherished the bond between humans and animals, frequently participating in traditional celebrations of animals and ecology that call for protection, healing, and compassion for pets and wildlife; and

WHEREAS, the City of Huntsville, Alabama, is leasing an area of right-of-way owned by the State of Alabama and utilized as a dog park currently known as the "Downtown Dog Spot" located generally along the road currently known as Cleveland Avenue, between Church Street and Meridian Street, and more particularly described in Resolution No. 24-157; and

ORDINANCE NO. 26-387

WHEREAS, in order to make it more convenient for voters to vote and to facilitate the efficient administration of the election process; and

WHEREAS, in the furtherance of the aforementioned objectives it is necessary to change the existing precincts within the City of Huntsville and to change the places of holding elections in certain of the precincts within the City of Huntsville, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama acts pursuant to the provisions of Code of Alabama, Section 11-46-1, et seq., and other applicable laws and Court orders when changing election precincts and designating the places of holding elections.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, that the City Council does hereby repeal and replace Ordinance No 94-523, adopted on July 14, 1994, and all subsequent amendments thereto, and does hereby establish the boundaries of each election precinct within the City of Huntsville, Alabama, and the numerical designation of each election precinct within the City of Huntsville, Alabama, and does hereby designate the places of holding elections, which shall also be known as voting places, in each election precinct within the City of Huntsville, Alabama, as set forth in the written descriptions which are attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and made a part hereof as if set out in full herein.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the boundaries established herein shall become effective immediately and shall be in effect for all municipal elections held in the City of Huntsville, Alabama, with the first of said elections to be the municipal election in August 2026.

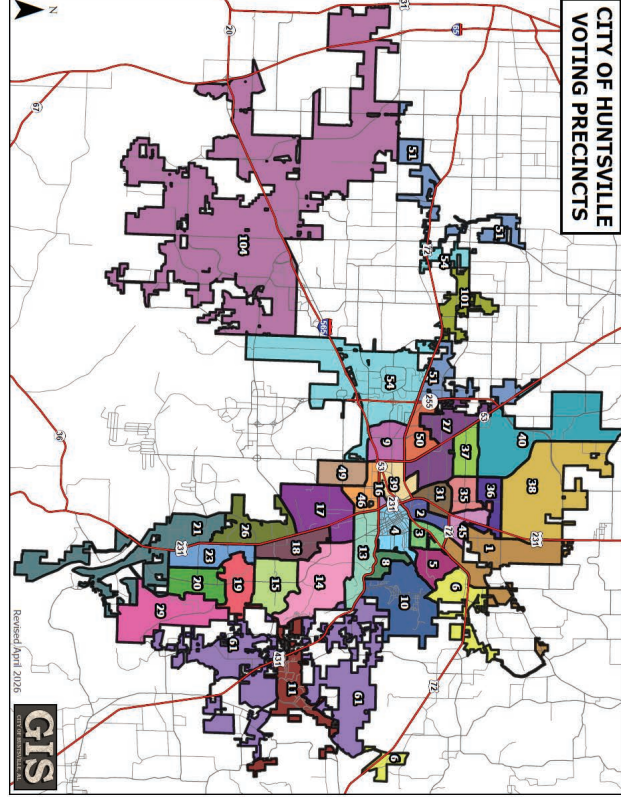

ORDINANCE NO. 26-388

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama as follows:

Section 1. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, Chapter 3 – Alcoholic Beverages, Article III. – Licenses, Division 3. – Operation, Subsection (a) of Section 3-133. – Hours of sale and operation, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 3-133. - Hours of sale and operation.

(a) Retail licensees. It shall be unlawful for any retail licensee, its owner, manager, servant, agent, or employee, to sell, offer for sale or to serve, or to dispense for reward, or offer to serve, or dispense for reward, or to allow the consumption of alcoholic beverages upon the city licensed premises, on the days and during the hours hereinafter enumerated as follows:

- (1) Prohibited hours for on-premises lounge liquor retailers and special events retailers shall be from 2:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. weekdays, which includes Saturdays, and from 2:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Sundays; for special retailers prohibited hours shall be every day from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.; for all other on-premises licensed retailers prohibited hours shall be from 2:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. Monday through Friday and from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday.
- (2) Prohibited hours for off-premises class II lounge liquor retailers shall be everyday from 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.; for all other off-premises retailers prohibited hours shall be every day from 1:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m.

Section 2. The severability provisions of section 1-8 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Huntsville, Alabama are specifically included herein by reference as if fully set forth.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption and publication.

WHEREAS, Cook's Development, LLC, an Alabama limited liability company, by Brian C. Cook, as its Manager, being the owner, as the term is defined by Section 11-42-20, Code of Alabama 1975, of all the property or territory hereinafter particularly described (which property or territory is hereinafter referred to as "the Property"), filed with the City Clerk of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, a signed and written petition requesting that the Property be annexed to the City of Huntsville, Alabama, which petition is on file with the City Clerk of the City of Huntsville, Alabama; and

ORDINANCE NO. 22-971

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HUNTSVILLE, ALABAMA

The public welfare requiring it, and under authority granted by Section 11-52-78 of the 1975 Code of Alabama, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, as follows:

1. That the following area, land lying on the west of County Line Rd and north of Old Highway 20, which area is now shown and classified on the Official Zoning Maps of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, Commercial Industrial Park District, shall be shown and classified on the Official Zoning Maps of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, as Highway Business C-4 District, in the Zoning Ordinances of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, said property being particularly described as follows:

All that part of Section 24, Township 04 South, Range 03 West of the Huntsville Meridian, in the City of Huntsville, Limestone County, Alabama more particularly described as beginning at a point located at the Southeast Corner of said Section 24; thence North 00 Degrees 16 Minutes 05 Seconds West, 1328.47 feet to a point; said point is further described as the Point of True Beginning; thence from the Point of True Beginning, North 88 Degrees 39 Minutes 39 Seconds West, 537.27 feet to a point; thence North 88 Degrees 40 Minutes 11 Seconds West, 937.07 feet to a point; thence South 89 Degrees 49 Minutes 53 Seconds West, 325.02 feet to a point; thence North 02 Degrees 56 Minutes 21 Seconds East, 70.35 feet to a point; thence North 02 Degrees 04 Minutes 19 Seconds East, 493.03 feet to a point; thence South 88 Degrees 03 Minutes 29 Seconds East, 315.39 feet to a point; thence South 88 Degrees 35 Minutes 40 Seconds East, 662.00 feet to a point; thence North 02 Degrees 49 Minutes 51 Seconds East, 112.82 feet to a point; thence South 88 Degrees 50 Minutes 34 Seconds East, 303.72 feet to a point; thence South 88 Degrees 50 Minutes 34 Seconds East, 505.59 feet to a point; thence South 01 Degree 13 Minutes 20 Seconds West, 665.89 feet back to the Point of True Beginning and containing 24.86 acres, more or less.

2. The boundaries of the above district as described and defined above are hereby established and shall be shown on the Official Zoning Maps of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, on file in the Planning Division of the Urban Development Department, in accordance with the various classifications herein enumerated and hereafter the regulations governing said district under the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, shall apply to the area so described.

3. This ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of publication.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-970

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, has given consideration to an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance, a synopsis of said amendment being as follows:

- (1) The rezoning of certain land lying on the west of County Line Rd and north of Old Highway 20 from Commercial Industrial Park District to Highway Business C-4 District.
- (2) The first publication of this resolution, this synopsis, and the ordinance hereinafter set out at length shall be in the Huntsville Times on the 1st day of January, 2023, and the second publication shall be one week thereafter on the 8th day of January, 2023, both of which publications shall be at least 15 days in advance of the date of the public hearing hereinafter referred to.

WHEREAS, it is the judgement and opinion of the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, that consideration should be given to the adoption of an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, in accordance with said request;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, as follows:

1. That the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, shall meet at 5:30 p.m. on the 26th day of January, 2023, in the Council Chambers of the City of Huntsville Administration Building at 308 Fountain Circle in the City of Huntsville, Alabama, for the purpose of holding a public hearing at which time and place all persons, parties in interest and cities who desire, shall have an opportunity to be heard in opposition to or in favor of said Ordinance No. 22-971, which is introduced by the City Council of the City of Huntsville on the 1st day of December, 2022, amending the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Huntsville, Alabama.
