SYNOPSIS OF AN ORDINANCE WHEREBY THE CITY OF HUNTSVILLE, ALABAMA, GRANTS TO SPECTRUM SOUTHEAST, LLC, A DELAWARE LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY, THE NON-EXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO USE THE RIGHTS-OF-WAY TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE ITS NETWORK AND TO PROVIDE COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH AND SUBJECT TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF A RIGHTS-OF-WAY USE AGREEMENT BETWEEN SPECTRUM SOUTHEAST, LLC AND THE CITY OF HUNTSVILLE, ALABAMA.

- On May 28, 2026, the City Council for the City of Huntsville, Alabama, adopted Ordinance No. 26-450, which granted to Spectrum Southeast, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, for a ten-year period from the effective date, which is the date of publication, the non-exclusive right to utilize the rights-of-way in the corporate limits of the City of Huntsville, Alabama ("City"), in order to construct its network in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions of the Rights-of-Way Use Agreement between Spectrum Southeast, LLC and the City (the "Use Agreement").
- The Use Agreement authorizes Spectrum Southeast, LLC, subject to the City's police powers, including the City's management of its rights-of-way, to construct and operate a fiber-optic network in order to provide its communications services, subject to the terms of the Use Agreement. Communication services are defined as services, other than cable service or any other multichannel video services, which are available to customers or subscribers, either on a wholesale or retail basis, through facilities that enable the provision, whether bundled or unbundled, of voice, video, data, or advanced communications services, including telecommunications services, information and data services, and Internet services. The term also includes the lease, license, sale, or other right of use provided to other persons, including other communications service providers, of portions of the network including facilities, fiber (whether dark or fit), or capacity thereon.
- In exchange, the Use Agreement requires Spectrum Southeast, LLC to pay to the City on an annual basis a use fee based on a per linear foot fee derived from the dimensions of the Company's linear facilities that are to be installed in the rights-of-way. Spectrum Southeast, LLC is also required, among other requirements, to indemnify the City, maintain insurance coverage, and post security.

Redstone Arsenal Environmental Program Public Comment Period – June 10, 2026-July 10, 2026 Proposed Corrective Measures at RSA-028 and RSA-E

The U.S. Army Garrison at Redstone Arsenal is proposing to implement corrective measures at RSA-028, In-Ground Oil/Water Separator, 5693 Area, Operable Unit 10, and RSA-E, No. 2 Fuel Oil Spill, Tank 5693 at the Fuel Farm, Operable Unit 06, located on 28 acres in the eastern-central portion of Redstone Arsenal. RSA-028 was a bulk fuel farm that housed aboveground storage tanks, oil/water separators, and fuel transfer stations that began operation in the early 1940s. Periodic spills and leaks occurred during its operation. RSA-E was established as a site when 58,584 gallons of No. 2 fuel oil were inadvertently released from a tank located in the southern portion of RSA-028 in 1985. Fuel recovery efforts minimized the amount of fuel that drained into the environment.

The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act facility investigations and follow on fate and transport modeling at RSA-028 and RSA-E concluded that soils do not pose an unacceptable threat to human health via direct exposure pathways or leaching from soil to groundwater. However, the groundwater beneath RSA-028 and RSA-E is contaminated with metals, semivolatile organic compounds, and volatile organic compounds and potentially poses unacceptable risk to future site receptors if the groundwater is developed as a potable source. Additionally, surface water in a drainage ditch running along the east-southeast portion of RSA-028 contains elevated 1-methylnaphthalene, manganese, and iron concentrations. The iron has precipitated out of the water, resulting in flocculants that act as a smothering agent for aquatic invertebrates and plants.

The preferred corrective measures for groundwater and surface water consist of the following actions:

- Monitored natural attenuation processes with long-term monitoring are expected to naturally and effectively reduce the concentrations of chemicals of concern until cleanup goals are reached.
- Continuation of installation-wide groundwater land-use controls to ensure that groundwater under RSA-028 and RSA-E is not used for potable purposes until cleanup goals are reached.

The final corrective measures will be selected only after acceptance by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management and after this public comment period has ended and all comments have been reviewed and considered.

Redstone Arsenal Environmental Program Public Comment Period – June 10, 2026-July 10, 2026 Proposed Corrective Measures at RSA-219

The U.S. Army Garrison at Redstone Arsenal is proposing to implement corrective measures at RSA-219, Chemical Storage Area in Salvage Yard Operable Unit 12, located in the southeastern portion of Redstone Arsenal. The site boundary covers approximately 5 acres within and near the current Defense Logistics Agency Salvage Yard, located at the end of Warehouse Road. Approximately 70 percent of the site is still in use for non-chemical salvage and storage. A drainage ditch runs through the center of the site. Beginning in the 1950s, the site was used for short-term storage of materials intended for salvage, including drums of solvents, and for burning/disposal of solvents in a burn pit.

The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act facility investigation for RSA-219 concluded that the Army's historical operations at RSA-219 have resulted in releases of hazardous substances to soil and groundwater that pose unacceptable risks to human health receptors, primarily from polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons in the ditch soil under hypothetical future residential site use and volatile organic compounds, explosive compounds, and pesticides in groundwater under a potable water use scenario.

The preferred corrective measures for soil, groundwater, and soil vapor consist of the following actions:

- Excavation of contaminated soils in the ditch, backfill of the ditch excavations with clean soil, and restoration of site area.
- Membrane Interface Probe-Hydraulic Profiling Tool survey to assist in refinement of monitoring locations for the solvent plume under the former burn pit.
- In situ enhanced bioremediation/in situ chemical reduction treatment for the contaminated groundwater.
- Monitored natural attenuation and long-term monitoring of chemicals in groundwater.
- For the duration of the long-term monitoring, land-use control implementation procedures for groundwater will follow those already in place with the installation-wide groundwater.
- If supported by soil vapor sampling, implementation of land-use controls for vapor intrusion protection of an occupant of a future building erected on RSA-219.

The final corrective measures will be selected only after acceptance by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management, this public comment period has ended, and all comments have been reviewed and considered.
